Speakers

Luke Barnett started his career in technical dentistry in 1976 and after qualifying, took a specialist interest in dental ceramics, setting up his own business in 1985. Luke and his team have established themselves as one of the UK's most influential ceramic specialists, working out of his state-of-the-art facility in Watford.

Luke is a founding member of the British Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry (BACD) and was chairman of the laboratory committee until November 2007. He remains on the Board of Directors at sub-committee level and sits on an Accreditation Board of Examiners. He is the first technician to achieve the levels of excellence required to obtain BACD accreditation. He is a sustaining member of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry.

Anthony Laurie is Eastman-trained and highly qualified, with over 30 years' experience in dental technology. He worked for over 20 years with Dr Michael Wise as his in-house technician and wrote the technical appendix to 'Failure in the Restored Dentition, Management and Treatment'. He lectures extensively, both internationally and in the UK, and is the author of numerous publications. Anthony is one of only three people in the UK to have been conferred Fellowship of the City and Guilds for Dentistry and is also a Fellow of the British Institute of Dental and Surgical Technicians.

He is an active member of many associations, including, The Harley Technicians Study Club (HTSC) and the Dental Laboratories Association (DLA). Anthony is the proud recipient of industry awards: UK Technician of the year 2003 and the prestigious Dennison Award in 2006.

Paul Mallett is a well-known face on the orthodontic speaker circuit, both nationally and internationally. He is an active member of the Orthodontic Technicians Association (OTA), serving as secretary for many years, as well as an elected member of the DTA. He was recently president of the DTA and also serves on the GDC's registration committee as a co-opted member.

Ed Martin has worked in healthcare marketing for the past 15 years following graduation from the University of Hertfordshire with a degree in Business. In 2001, Ed left the corporate world to set up the healthcare marketing agency StockdaleMartin. For the past 8 years Ed has worked with both blue chip organisations and small businesses to develop powerful and cost-effective marketing solutions.

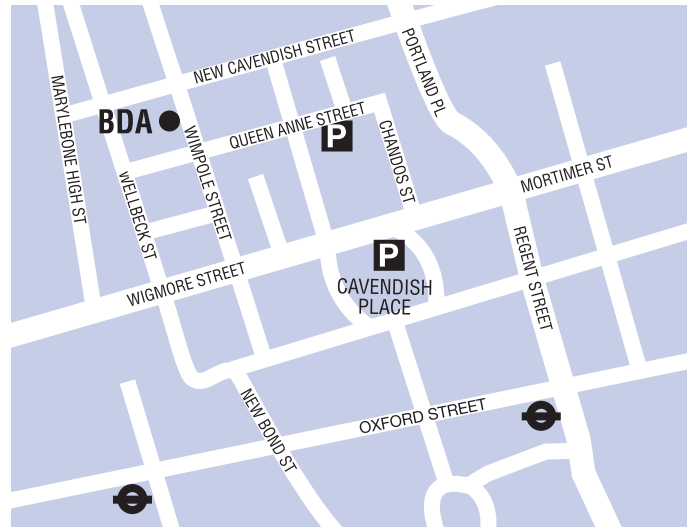
